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Course Advice & Guidance

The Sixth Form Team offers outstanding advice, support and guidance to help students make the right decisions in choosing their programme of study. We have a team of Year 12 & 13 subject mentors working alongside our excellent specialist Advanced Level teachers, to offer advice on every course from the student perspective. Each programme of study is tailored to individual needs, depending on students' particular interests, skills and abilities.

Choosing the right Programme of Study

Before finalising course choices, students are advised to read the course flyers carefully to make sure they know what each course entails. They should consider whether they are interested in the topics covered and whether the assessment structure is appropriate for them. Some students will perform best in coursework assignments rather than exams or may prefer a course with a more practical focus. We have a range of BTEC and Diploma Courses which are proving very successful and increasingly popular.

Students will benefit from speaking to the specialist teachers and subject mentors at our Curriculum Seminars and Open Evening. They should also take advantage of the opportunity to try out new subjects at our Sixth Form Taster Day. Students should consider their career options carefully and ensure they are choosing subjects which will enable them to pursue their chosen career path. Students also need a range of courses which will take into account their interests, academic strengths and skills. They will be given high quality information, advice and guidance at interview. Students will then have a further opportunity to speak to subject specialists at our Induction Day before their programme of study is finalised once they receive their GCSE results.

Course Entry Criteria

Our course entry criteria are reviewed each year and our most up to date version is enclosed in the back of the prospectus. Students are advised to read the criteria carefully and choose courses which match their particular skills and predicted grades. They should seek guidance from our subject specialists if they are unsure about the suitability of a course.

Higher Education and Careers Support

Students follow an intensive programme of preparation for their future career pathway and can access extensive advice and support. During Year 12, students follow a broad careers programme where we identify potential career opportunities accessed through university degrees, apprenticeships, Further Education, employment or training. We run an annual trip to the Bournemouth Higher Education Convention and encourage individual visits to University Open Days.

In partnership with external providers, we also deliver a one day Future Pathways conference, aimed at supporting students' applications to university or vocational progression routes. For those students who choose to make an application to university, we explore current issues on student finance, student life, course entry requirements and how to write an effective personal statement. For students following a vocational or employment pathway we explore apprenticeships, trends in the current job market, how to put together an effective CV and guidance on interview technique. All students are encouraged to undertake a period of work experience in order to support their future career aspirations.

Oxbridge National Conference

In Year 12, students who wish to submit an Oxbridge application attend a national conference run by Oxford and Cambridge Universities. Professors provide information and advice about the admissions process and students can witness a mock interview with an undergraduate student. This is followed by residential visits to Oxford and Cambridge Universities in June or July, providing students with an excellent opportunity to live in the halls of residence, attend a variety of subject seminars and get advice from current undergraduates and professors.

ENGLISH LITERATURE ENGLISH LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE MEDIA STUDIES | FILM STUDIES

English

Studying English and related subjects at A level is an excellent choice for anyone who enjoys wide reading, discussion and analysis of texts.

You will develop as a confident and reflective reader of a range of texts (including film and other media texts). You will learn to use critical concepts and terminology. You will also use have the opportunity to be creative in your coursework – both in the choice of task and in the production of your work.

English is taught in suited rooms. English Literature and English Language and Literature students are supported by the provision of a wide range of texts to enable student autonomy in coursework choices. Film Studies and Media Studies students benefit from state-of-the-art ICT hardware to support the production of media texts, such as short films and advertisements.

Students are taught in whole classes and smaller groups. Emphasis is placed on students' engagement with the subject and they are expected to join in discussions and give presentations.

A level English and related subjects combine well with a range of A levels including History, Psychology and Religious Philosophy and Ethics.

Skills developed in English Literature and related subjects, include the ability to analyse and interpret, to formulate a coherent argument and to communicate clearly, both orally and in writing. These skills are highly regarded, both in further study at university and in the job market.

Students who have studied A level English have gone into a wide range of careers, for example, in Education, Journalism, Law, the Media and Marketing.

In the past students have gone on to study English at some of the country's most prestigious universities including the University of Oxford.

Mathematics

This curriculum area consists of Mathematics, Further Mathematics and Economics. The A level courses are taught in many styles including practical demonstrations, internet based activities and collaborative investigations by highly skilled, enthusiastic, specialist teachers.

The department runs lunchtime support sessions several times a week which enable individuals to reinforce their understanding of the harder mathematical concepts and help them fulfil their potential. In order to stretch students further, the department runs timetabled STEP (the Cambridge and Warwick University entrance examination) lessons which are proving very popular and effective. Highcliffe STEP lessons are taught on a model based on university tutorials, involving group work and discussion.

Students achieve excellent results in their exams and we have a strong tradition of students going on to study Mathematics at top universities including Oxbridge. One of our former students has recently been promoted to a Walter Galpin Exhibitioner, a highly prestigious student post at Balliol College Oxford for outstanding work in Mathematics. Career progression routes include Architecture, Engineering, Medicine and Business.

Logically, Maths made the most sense when choosing a subject to complement my other science based subjects. Maths opens many doors, all of which lead to fantastic new opportunities. By studying Maths I have become much more skilled at logical thinking, enabling me to look at the world in a new way.

Extra-Curricular Opportunities

Year 12 students complete the Senior UKMT Maths Challenge every year with excellent results consistently being achieved and candidates regularly qualify into the more advanced rounds.

Trips have included revision and study sessions for various modules at A Level. Over the last few years the chess club has grown considerably with A level students playing each other as well as helping younger students enhance their skills.

All students have the opportunity to support KS3 or KS4 students with their Mathematics by volunteering to help in lessons or in Numeracy sessions in tutor time. Some students volunteer as Maths mentors in local primary schools and others have helped deliver and plan a series of lessons to the Gifted and Talented mathematicians in local feeder schools.

At Highcliffe we offer the following Science subjects at AS and A level: Biology, Human Biology, Chemistry, Physics alongside a variety of Social Sciences: Psychology, Childcare and Health & Social Care.

All the Science subjects offer the opportunity to pursue a variety of career pathways such as: Research, Healthcare, Environmental Conservation, Education, Veterinary Science, Medicine, Marine Biology, Biotechnology, Agriculture, Food Science, Forensic Science, Astronomy/Space Industries, Computer Science, Dentistry, Electronics, Engineering, Materials Science, Pharmacy, Physiotherapy.

At Highcliffe there are eleven fully equipped and refurbished laboratories and an ICT laboratory with extra ICT for data logging and processing, digital microscopy, web browsing and interactive learning programmes via the school server.

All students are given textbooks relevant to their specification for the duration of their course in the Sixth Form and revision guides are also available. In addition there is a large amount of science resources available to students in the Learning Resource Centre, including scientific publications, which students can access for independent study. Science teachers have produced resources that can be accessed by students via the school's resources bank.

Recent Highcliffe student successes in Science include: studying Physics at both Oxford and Cambridge Universities, Biological Sciences at Oxford, Medicine at Oxford. Every year we have students who go on to study Medicine and a whole range of science related degree courses at top universities.



Extra-Curricular Opportunities

We offer a range of trips and visits to complement the Science courses including a residential field trip in the Purbecks, a visit to the Biomedical Imaging Unit at Southampton University Hospital, Institute of Physics lecture tours, Southampton University teatime lectures and Physics at Thorpe Park.

In addition we offer a range of extra-curricular activities including participating in the Engineering in Education Scheme in conjunction with the Royal Navy, entering the Biology, Chemistry and Physics Olympiads, Gold Crest Awards, and Nuffield Awards. We assist students in their applications for "A Year in Industry" placements and Headstart, Engineering based pre-university courses, provided by the Engineering Development Trust.

Sixth Form students are also involved in helping with Science and Eco-clubs in the lower school and promoting Science within the school, for example becoming involved as science mentors during Science Week.

Art, Design and Technology

The quality of Art, Design and Technology education is fundamental to providing a dynamic future for the country. "The design process, at its best, integrates the aspirations of art, science and culture."

The Da Vinci Centre is a vibrant, exciting and highly rewarding place to spend time. It is home to a diverse range of creative disciplines which are delivered by subject specialists to a level that far exceeds A level examination requirements. Facilities are second to none, with teaching areas that are light and spacious, software that is of industry standard and equipment which allows visual outcomes to be realised to a professional level. Teaching methods focus on enhancing the maturity of our students by utilising open-ended schemes of work. A strong focus on key academic skills develops confidence and diversity and enables progression to employment or prestigious university courses.

In the Da Vinci Centre we encourage our students to access our outstanding resources outside of lesson time. Year 12 and 13 students access workshops and studios at any time and often support lower school classes to enrich their learning. Individual tutorials take place frequently and assist our students in shaping their own learning.

Our students progress to a variety of careers and courses from Foundation Degrees to Marine Engineering Degrees.

Extra-Curricular Opportunities

We endeavour to provide our students with a rich experience when studying in the Da Vinci Centre.

We do this by organising a range of trips that enable students to be inspired and motivated by some of the very best work being produced by artists and designers, both nationally and internationally. The large museums and galleries of London and 'New Designers' exhibitions provide our students with the benchmark of quality for which we strive. Overseas trips are run to provide a cultural experience that adds depth to our students' study.

Competitions are entered which can enhance and extend our students' experiences. The Arkwright Scholarship is an example of how our students are encouraged to consider their future career path at Key Stage 4 to help provide funding and high level support at Key Stage 5.

Our Sixth Form students are inspirational to the rest of the school and their presence in other lessons provides role models for our younger students. Our A Level students regularly exhibit their work in public exhibitions and play a pivotal role in developing excellence within Art Design and Technology.

Expressive Arts

If you are interested in studying any of the Expressive Arts subjects in the Sixth Form, Highcliffe is the place to be.

The Expressive Arts curriculum area has gone from strength to strength at Highcliffe in recent years. The ethos is one that encourages mutual support and students to strive to be the best. Our most important aim is to continue to raise standards and provide further access to Dance, Drama, Music and Physical Education, while allowing students to develop as independent learners.

There is a full range of subjects across all areas, with BTEC Performing Arts (Dance), BTEC Performing Arts (Acting), A Levels in Music, Music Technology and BTEC Music (Performing), A Level Physical Education and the OCR National Diploma in Sport (double award). There is also the opportunity to extend your coaching skills in dance through the Community Sports Leader Award (CSLA) and Dance Sports Leader Award (DSLA).

All the curriculum areas have excellent resources, with the Dance Studio, Performance Hall and a wealth of music facilities, including fully equipped Music Technology rooms, with a suite of computers, each running a range of music software for composing, audio recording and editing and a bespoke recording studio. The PE facilities continue to develop with the recently refurbished Olympian Fitness Suite.

The teaching of all the Expressive Arts subjects is further enhanced by the highly trained specialists and the small group sizes that allow students to benefit from a supportive and caring environment that promotes effective learning. Revision lessons and academic mentoring sessions are available to support students with coursework and examination technique.

Studying an Expressive Arts subject can help students access a diverse number of career paths and a wide variety of Higher Education courses. Past students have gone onto become teachers, fitness coaches and managers, television presenters; others have gained access into some of the most elite and prestigious universities in their field. It can also support entry onto scholarships in the USA.

Extra-Curricular Opportunities

The extra-curricular opportunities at Highcliffe cover every curriculum area and are full of diversity.

Within the Acting course there are many opportunities for our students to work in other schools supporting students (giving performances, running workshops etc) across a wide age range of ages. Acting and Dance students have the chance to work with other professional practitioners in the Performing Arts field either in school or off site. There are also trips to see professional performances , such as Matthew Bourne's 'Early Adventures' and various Richard Alston pieces, while dance leaders help to choreograph main school pieces including the Pavilion Dance Show Case Performance of 'In Between the Lines'.

The Music team offer the Sixth Form Choir, 'Guitarmania' and Jazz Band. Music, Dance and Acting students have also taken lead roles in recent school productions such as 'We Will Rock You' as well as having the opportunity to be involved in school productions such as 'Into the Woods'.

Within Physical Education there are Football, Rugby, Netball and Rounders teams that compete in local and county competitions. Other enrichment activities include the Duke of Edinburgh and Sports Leader Awards, which give students the opportunity to coach within feeder schools and run local competitions.

Humanities

The Humanities curriculum offers a wide range of subjects which focus on the human dimension. The subjects studied all consider man's interaction in a variety of different contexts – natural, scientific, technological, philosophical, historical, sociological, cultural, spiritual and moral.

The courses offer a unique opportunity to study different disciplines and embrace the knowledge that provides the basis for world civilisations, while at the same time developing students' powers of self-expression and critical thinking.

Humanities subjects are taught in well-resourced rooms and students are encouraged to use the ICT facilities for independent study.

Employers know that Humanities students tend to be articulate, literate and cultured, with a high degree of knowledge and for this reason their career prospects are good. Humanities can lead to a wide variety of careers including Teaching, the Media, Journalism, Tourism, Local Government, Voluntary Agencies or Research.

Extra-Curricular Opportunities

Humanities students have the opportunity to not only experience the extensive range of activities offered by the courses, but also to develop their confidence, responsibility, leadership and communication skills.

Departments organise a wide range of subject specific trips to complement the work undertaken in the classroom. There is also a range of visits and opportunities to develop new skills in foreign lands – cultural trips to Prague, Berlin and Auschwitz.

Students can attend residential fieldwork courses such as investigations into coastal processes in the Purbecks. As well as the A Level fieldwork trips, students also have the chance to take part in KS3 and KS4 trips as volunteers. Students have the opportunity for personal development by offering peer and mentoring support in humanities classes within the lower school. This is invaluable to our younger students and is an activity which universities and employers regard in a positive light.

Our A level students develop their active contribution to a wider society and have the opportunity to work in partnership with the local community, business and industry, to enhance opportunities for lifelong learning in the context of humanities.

A career in Business and IT in the next few years will involve working with technologies that are going to be even more transformational than the amazing changes we have already seen.

Highcliffe benefits from a team of teachers with a wealth of relevant business and ICT experience and has outstanding facilities. There are five purpose built ICT suites which boast the latest computer equipment and industry standard software. The faculty subscribes to numerous websites and learning packages allowing students to study independently outside of school.

The world in which we live is dominated by businesses big and small. Businesses are dynamic organisations which reflect the values of society and the people working within them. A study of business will help you to gain an insight into both.

As the IT Industry is forecast to grow five times faster than the UK average there will be over half a million new IT professionals needed over the next five years.

Extra-Curricular Opportunities

There is a wealth of extra-curricular opportunities for ICT, Computing and Business students at Highcliffe. The curriculum area has numerous contacts within the local business community and as a result there are trips to local businesses designed to consolidate student learning by experiencing first-hand what is taught in the classroom.

In addition to these trips we have guest speakers from local business and visiting lecturers from Bournemouth University who are able to engage students in areas of interest beyond the curriculum.

Sixth Form students are also given the opportunity to compete against students from other schools in the Team Enterprise Competition and Student Investor in which students manage their own share portfolio and track their investments.

Students from the curriculum area also have the opportunity to earn some extra pocket money by running the ICT club at lunchtimes for students in KS3 or KS4. This enables students to develop the skills needed to manage a classroom environment, act as role models for students from across the school and develop their leadership and communications skills.

Modern Foreign Languages

Studying a language at A Level opens up a world of opportunities and with the growing trend towards globalisation and transitory workforces, proficiency in a foreign language has never been so important. Students develop their fluency and understanding of their chosen language, as well as learning about the history, culture and topical social and political issues that affect people around the globe.

Highcliffe Modern Foreign Languages Department is extremely well-equipped with two purpose built language laboratories (with one specifically for Sixth Form). We have a foreign language assistant for each language and every Sixth Form student benefits from weekly speaking practice in small groups or one to one. We also subscribe to numerous websites and magazines, allowing students to work independently on their language skills outside of school.

Having another language can increase your salary by 8 - 20% (CILT) and opens up a whole range of career opportunities, whether you are looking to work in law, education, business, tourism or government, to name but a few areas. A Level Languages also complement many other A Level choices and further enhance your opportunities at degree level and beyond. In recent years several of our students have continued their language studies at some of the country's top universities. Some chose to study Languages with another specialism, such as Law or Economics, opening a gateway to a whole plethora of careers.

Extra-Curricular Opportunities

Studying languages at Highcliffe Sixth Form offers a wealth of extra-curricular opportunities. Students have the opportunity to travel to countries where their chosen language is spoken. Recent trips have included a Spanish exchange in Andalucía and a French work experience trip to Normandy, where students spent a week perfecting their language skills.

Many of our linguists also choose to study the Foreign Language Leader Award. This lunchtime class provides students with the skills needed to teach languages to younger students with the eventual aim of teaching a lesson to Year 7 or primary school pupils. These students also help out with many trips and activities for younger students, providing excellent experience for their university or job applications.

Sixth Form students are also given many other opportunities in the Modern Foreign Languages Department. Recently students have had the opportunity to take part in South West Routes into Languages Speaking Competition, the European Union Translation Competition and the Highcliffe Primary Languages Festival amongst many others.

We offer a comprehensive programme of enrichment activities, social events and trips based on student interests. Students will meet new people, broaden their skills and experience and impress future employers.

Student Leadership and the wider community

The Sixth Form committee, led by our Head Girl and Head Boy, is here to support and enhance student life in the Sixth Form. The committee is run by students for students and meets regularly to voice the opinions of the Sixth Form as well as making key decisions about forthcoming events and activities in the wider school community.

We recognise the importance of developing leadership skills and the range of opportunities we offer is outstanding. Roles within the student leadership team are extensive.
