

HURRICANE MARIA: Dominica 19 September 2017

CHRISTCHURCH SCHOOL'S BOOK APPEAL

Following the devastation of Hurricane Maria in Dominica one year ago, when 98% of island roofs were damaged, and some houses damaged beyond repair, many children were displaced and traumatised by the experience. Working closely with the Dominican government, areas that have been most affected and need most help have been identified and the **Jermain Defoe Foundation** has been helping to refurbish and repair schools on the island. Helping children and families to rebuild their lives, we know how important it is for schools to continue giving children their education.

To this end, the Foundation is collecting good quality, used children's books for the children to enjoy at the Sineku Primary School.

Working with the Jermain Defoe Foundation, we are hoping that schools in the local area will be willing to help this good cause, by asking pupils and staff to bring in books from home that they no longer read. The books would be collected from your school whenever it suits you. We would anticipate that this appeal will be confined to this half term, so that the books will be at Sineku School in time for Christmas.

BACKGROUND

Many of you, and your pupils, will know Jermain Defoe through his career at AFC Bournemouth. In 2010 he donated money to the Soufriere Primary School to refurbish their library after the damage caused by Hurricane Tomas. This led to the establishment of his Foundation in 2013, which has supported the Holy Family Children's Home and built the Rainbow Children's Home, both on St Lucia. Fundraising includes annual football tournaments and gala dinners, as well as various appeals for equipment, toys and now books. There will be a Foundation presence at the Bournemouth Marathon Festival 6-7 October. Why not sign up and join in?

Following Jermain's close friendship with **Bradley Lowery**, the Foundation expanded its reach in the UK to help children with life-threatening illnesses, particularly other young people with neuroblastoma, a rare form of child cancer. Jermain was awarded the **OBE** in the 2018 Birthday Honours List for his services to charity.
