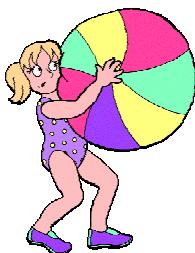

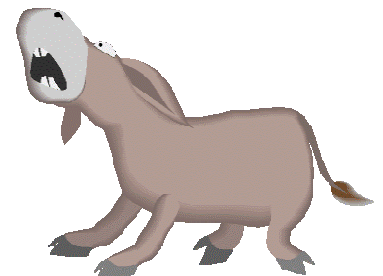


There are some children and donkeys on a beach.
