Dear Student,

Ms Becky Johnson, Open Spaces & Countryside Strategy Officer, Christchurch and East Dorset Partnership has asked me to circulate these details to give all the opportunity to have their say on these proposals:

Christchurch Borough Council are proposing to construct a mountain biking facility at Chewton Bunny in Highcliffe. This bike park, referred to as the South Shore Bike Park, looks to include the popular "North Shore" style of mountain biking into a new and exciting facility which we do not yet have in the Borough. This proposal is currently out to public consultation until 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2012 and further detail can be found in the document attached.

The proposal has been funded by the Dorset Heathland Interim Planning Framework with the aim to provide an alternative mountain biking facility to that of the internationally protected local heathland. Chewton Bunny is a coastal site that is currently the location of informal mountain biking activity. The Council regularly find tracks and informal dirt jumps on the site in hazardous areas close to footpaths. This proposal looks to engage with young people and particularly those with a mountain biking interest, to build a facility they can use safely and enjoy.

The Highcliffe community have voiced strong opinion on the proposals both in favour and against. However, out of nearly 300 responses received so far only 18 have been received from young people under the age of 25. We feel that young people are at the heart of this proposal and are therefore looking to engage with them to find out what they think. This is where we are hoping to have the support of the Highcliffe Schools to help us distribute this information.

All responses to the consultation must be made on the questionnaire provided to ensure equal opportunity. Although only 4 weeks remain it is important to the Council that young people have their say.
