

They are from Johoku High School, which is in Hiroshima – the city that suffered the first ever atomic bombing. They will be spending time with their buddies and coming along to your classes. They will be here until next Thursday. Please give them a warm welcome and make them feel a part of the school. If you want, why not say "Hello" to them in Japanese? This is "Konnichi-wa". **The Peace Project** - Everyone will have seen the assembly given by Mrs Bewley and Mrs Dedman all about the bombing of Hiroshima and the moving story of Sadako, who made the paper cranes. This was a terrible event which we must not allow to happen again. The paper crane has become a symbol of peace and, in order to signal our own desire for peace, we have set ourselves the target of making **1000** paper cranes.

This project forms a part of Highcliffe School's  $50^{th}$  anniversary celebrations. Highcliffe School first came into existence in 1963. This was only 18 years after the bombing of Hiroshima and the memories of that terrible event were still fresh in people's minds. On its  $50^{th}$  anniversary, we want to show that Highcliffe School is playing its part in ensuring that the atomic bombing and its horrific consequences are not forgotten.





During registration this week and next week, we will be making as many paper cranes as possible. They're not easy to make, but give it a go and by all means make some at home, too, and bring them in. When we have finished, we will display them in school and give some to our Japanese friends to take back to Hiroshima. They will then be displayed at the Children's Memorial in Peace Park, Hiroshima. By making a peace crane, you'll be taking a step in showing how we, the community of Highcliffe, on its 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, can send out a message of peace to the world. All under 16's must be accompanied by a responsible adult.


