Remembrance Day Tuesday 11th November:

"They shall grow not old as we that are left grow old:
Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn.
At the going down of the sun and in the morning
We will remember them."

At 11am on Tuesday 11th November we shall be marking Remembrance Day with the traditional one minute silence. A bell will ring at 11am to mark the beginning of the silence and again at 11.01am to mark its end. This is an important act for us all to participate in. War brings many victims and it is important that we all spend time to reflect on and remember the tragedy that war brings.

This year marks the 100th anniversary of the outbreak of the First World War. The Prime Minister said in August: "A hundred years ago today Britain entered the First World War and we are marking that centenary to honour those who served, to remember those who died, and to ensure that the lessons learnt live with us forever. It is right to remember the extraordinary sacrifice of a generation and we are all indebted to them because their most enduring legacy is our liberty."

In school Highcliffe students have helped create a most solemn commemorative memorial area by the lift in the entrance hall - all those soldiers from Highcliffe who died in the First World War have an individual cross and poppy in their memory. Take a moment to reflect on their sacrifice and how much we owe them.


