Volunteering on Brownsea Island

Have you ever thought about what it may be like to Volunteer with the National Trust on Brownsea Island with the Brownsea Island Youth Service Team (BIYST)?

No you say? You didn't know that the opportunity existed let alone that it was something that you could do?

My name is Amanda Shorey, I am the Outdoor Centre Warden and I also manage the BIYST (pronounced 'beast') volunteers. The team has been running for several years now and members start at 14 years old and go right up until they are 26. Individuals attend for a number of reasons, many of which are personal to themselves. Some come and use the opportunity to help with their Duke of Edinburgh award. This year we have had several people doing day volunteering and around 40 people doing their Gold Residential sections. Others attend because they are interested in a future career in outdoor activities or countryside management. Some come, just because it is something different to do, they enjoy it. Everyone who attends will learn something, Meet some new people and go home with a sense of achievement. Volunteering with the National Trust is also an excellent addiction to your CV.

An example of a typical day volunteering with BIYST starts off with a short boat trip to the Island from Sandbanks. Members then make their way up to the centre and get stuck right in with the tasks in hand. This year this has included building a path and a slipway, moving and fixing fencing, ground clearance, tree cutting along with designing and running a Scouting and Guiding festival for over 100 people. There is lots of get involved with!

It's generally a quick stop for lunch and then work continues until the return boat trip home. You should leave the Island with a smile on your face feeling tired from a day of hard, but very enjoyable volunteering.

Meetings take place during weekends. However, in the holidays they run during the weekdays too.

I hope that I have gained your attention and inspired you to come and join in with BIYST.
