- Look out for the notices for your Year Group every morning.

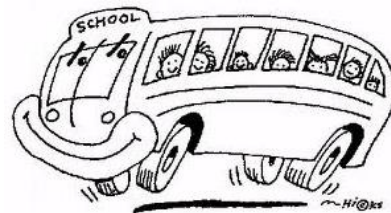

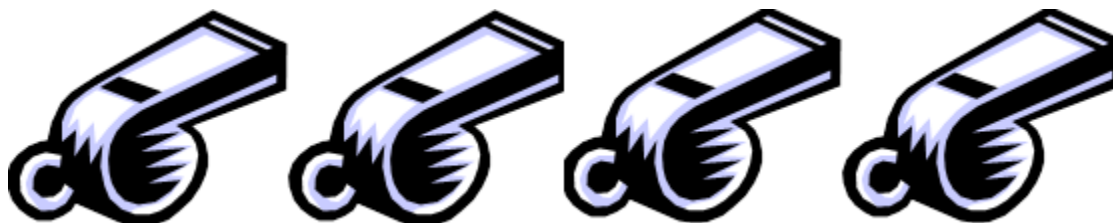
