HELPING TO DEVELOP MEMORY SKILLS

With all the exams going on presently the tips below may be useful for students. Knowing a range of strategies for 'remembering' is an important part of 'learning how to learn'. Techniques can include;




- Repetition/rote learning (multiplication tables)
- Effective review (regular revision of topics covered).
- Mnemonics (acronyms, rhyme/music, word association e.g. divorced beheaded died; divorced beheaded, survived to remember the fate of Henry VIII's wives).
- Symbolism (imagine an 'outrageous' visual to represent a person or action).
- Narrative sequence (make up a story to link facts e.g. the order of the planets in the solar system).
- Colour-coding (in our 'mind's eye', or used in diagrams and mind maps to identify links.
- Summarising (taking a topic and writing the key points in 50 words or 5 bullet points).

Once you have revised a topic try telling it to your little sister or even the dog!


