School Field: Students will soon be given permission to go on the school field at breaks and lunch. <u>Please</u> do not go on the field until this has been clearly announced.

Please make yourselves aware of the rules and routines for going on the field:

- When the field is open, the 'picnic area' at the front of school will also be open for those of you who want to sit quietly away from the ball games and other activities.
- If the red flag is on the field keep off!
- The bins and tables must not be moved.
- Use the litter bins do not drop litter!
- Respect each other's personal space no play-fighting, 'bundling' or contact sports of any kind.
- Rugby / 'contact' sports are not allowed.
- Games of football must have goals: do not use the litter bins as goals please.
- Stay away from the sand pits and surrounding area.
- Keep ball games well away from the buildings, fences and trees.
- Stay out of the trees and do not play with cones, branches, grass cuttings, etc.
- Do not congregate next to classroom windows and doors.
- Keep 5 metres away from the perimeter fences (the athletic track line is a good guide on the far side).

Crowdfunder Trees: The fruit trees that were supplied by the Crowdfunder Fruitshare project have been



delivered and have been planted in a good sunny location on the school grounds. Once the trees are established we will be able to look forward to an annual crop of apples, pears, plums, medlar and quince. We had an excellent turnout for this activity and it was nice to see some new faces from Year 7 helping the established ecoteam out. It was a big job! A big thank you to Mrs Collins, Mr Prodomo, Mrs James, Mr Booker and Mr O'Connor for expert help and supervision.

Grow and Sell: We were also pleased to welcome Mrs Harrison from Waitrose to view our Ecogarden this week. Earlier in the year we had a successful bid for a Waitrose 'Community Matters' award. The funds from this were used to purchase the stakes, buckles tree protectors and compost for the fruit trees.



In addition to this, Waitrose have kindly donated several 'Grow and Sell' kits to the Highcliffe Ecoclub These include a variety of seeds and equipment and the Highcliffe gardeners are looking forward to the prospect of selling some of the fruits and vegetables we produce in the garden using these kits later this Summer[.]



Garden and Pond: The Community Matters award has also allowed the Ecoteam to upgrade the garden which is now in full swing. We have planted several currant bushes and now have half of the beds in active production with broad beans, onions, potatoes, cabbage, garlic, raspberries and strawberries showing good progress. We have also been able to purchase netting and covers for the most

vulnerable crops· **It's at this time of year extra help is always welcome!** We meet on Tuesday afternoons after school in the garden area and work until about four o'clock· As always sensible footwear is essential!

The Pond area is also fully active since being relined, this is first time for a couple of years that it looks like it will be able to support a sizeable amphibian population. Students due to do pond dipping activities later in the year should be in for a treat!

ASTROSTEM: There are still some spaces available for the AstroSTEM activity that will run after Easter. This will be a six week session for Year 9 running on a Wednesday after school. The group will be undertaking a variety of activities including lunar mapping, asteroid detection and observation using the National Schools Telescope.
