Remembrance Day Wednesday 11th November.

"They shall grow not old as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning we will remember them."

At 11am on Wednesday 11th November we shall be marking Remembrance Day with the traditional one minute silence. A bell will ring at 11am to mark the beginning of the silence and again at 11.01 to mark its end. This is an important act for us all to participate in. War brings many victims and it is important that we all spend time to reflect on and remember the tragedy that war brings.

Many moving poems have been written about war and conflict. Below is a poem written on the back of an envelope in an air raid during the Blitz of London by John Pudney, a Royal Air Force officer about the RAF airmen – it became one of the most famous poems of the Second World War:

For Johnny

Do not despair For Johnny-head-in-air; He sleeps as sound As Johnny underground.

Fetch out no shroud For Johnny-in-the-cloud; And keep your tears For him in after years.

Better by far For Johnny-the-bright-star, To keep your head, And see his children fed.


