## Spelling Focus: Closing the Gap

Here are three words that are commonly misspelled:
environment
government
opportunity
Questions:

1. Where are these words Danger Zones?
2. What strategies would you use to remember the spellings? (There is a different strategy for each spelling.)

Here are some options:

- Learn a rule.
- Find the root word and build from that
- Make a silly sentence or use some other trick to help you remember.
- Sound it out
- Word within a word

Answers:

1. The Danger Zones for the above words are:
environment (sometimes the " $n$ " is missed out)
government (sometimes the " n " is missed out) opportunity (sometimes a " p " is missed out and the "or" part is misspelled.)
2. Here are some strategies:
environment - Look at the root word: environment

This is not a very well-known word so you might be better off sounding it out in an exaggerated way: En-vi-ron-ment

Or look for the word within the word: Ron loves the environment.

Government - Look at the root word: government.

We can all spell "govern". Well, government still keeps the "n".
3. opportunity

People often get this one wrong. Can you think of a way to remember this?
