Answers:

1. The Danger Zones for the above words are:

biased (sometimes the last sound is written with a "t")

opportunity (sometimes a "p" is missed out and the "or" part is misspelled.)

friend (sometimes the "l" is forgotten or swapped round with the "e")

2. Here are some strategies:

Biased – Sound it out: bias – ed

Opportunity – Look for a word within the word: Op + **port** + unity. We all know how to spell "port" so remember that opportunity has a "port" in it. (Thank you to Samuel Rapoport for this idea. He has received a commendation for this tip.)

3. Friend

This is a simple word, but one that people often get wrong. Can you think of a way to remember?

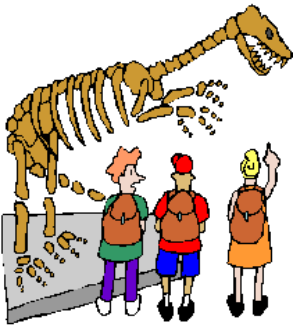

I am delighted to announce that Budmouth and Weymouth Golf Club have been working in partnership to reinstate Dorset in the English Schools Golf Association (ESGA). The Dorset Schools Golf Championship will take place on **Tuesday 25th April 2017** at Weymouth Golf Club, times TBC.

With many keen and able golfers in Dorset, we believe that our students deserve the opportunity to represent Dorset on the National stage and enjoy the experiences that a National competition offers. Founded in 1972 to promote golf within the school environment, the ESGA has produced many a professional golfer, some going on to win major championships. You can navigate through the ESG's website to learn about our previous Championships and Champions www.englishschoolsgolf.org

This year's competition will be in the following formats:

- U18 boys individual scratch
- U18 boys individual handicap
- U 18 Girls
- U18 team (3 players, best 2 scores to count. Teams can be mixed or single sex)

The 6 best U16 'scratch' boys and 3 lowest U16 girls 'scratch' will qualify for the NASUWT sponsored South-West of England Schools Championship at "The Players Club" in Avon on Tuesday 30th May 2017. The School Team championship will run in conjunction with the above event consisting of 3 Players with the best 2 net scores to count. The winning team will qualify for the NASUWT sponsored National Schools Team Championships at "Woodall Spa Golf Club" in Lincolnshire on Wednesday 12th July 2017. As a representative of the Dorset Schools Golf Association (DSGA), Des Lochrie will forward the competition winners to the ESGA.

Schools may enter as many individuals and teams as they like. Teams must be predetermined and made clear on entry. Please complete the attached entry form/s and return to Phil Morley by post, fax or email no later than the 7th April 2017. Entries received after this date will not be considered. Players must be registered with a club and have a CSGA certified handicap.

Unlike other regional tournaments, there is only one cost to enter both the team and individual event. Compared with other regions this is a saving of £50 per player. All players (whether individual or part of a team) must each pay a £10 entry fee to the Dorset Schools Golf Association. Cheques can be made payable to DSGA and can either be sent with the entry form or brought on the day. Gavin Rusling is the current club treasurer who will provide a full breakdown of the Associations finances at the DSGA AGM, date TBC. The entry fee will be used to cover our affiliation to the ESGA, green fees, trophies and post-match tea. There may also be additional money to help with the next stage of the competition.

Post event, we will evaluate the success of the competition and also start the wheels turning to form a DSGA committee. If you are interested in volunteering for a role within the DSGA, please speak to Des, Gavin or Phil on the day of the competition.

We look forward to seeing you on the 25th April, fingers crossed for some nice weather.

Cheques should be made payable to the "Dorset Schools Golf Association".

Each player must be in full time education and following a course at level 3 or below. This is strictly an U18 event.

To qualify for the U18 Area cup & team event players must have been born **on or after 1/9/98 (i.e. school year "12" or below)**. The Under-16 category (and entry to the Nationals) is for players born **on or after 1/9/02 (i.e. school year 10 or below)**. All entrants must be golf club members with a CONGU competition handicap. Handicaps will be checked online at the closing date. This may result in a player moving from one competition to the other.

CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES IS FRIDAY 7th April 2017
