Iceland 2019! (NOC)

Fantastic news that **Iceland 2019** is happening in the Sixth Form!

The biggest Sixth Form trip abroad ever will go to **Iceland in February 2019** and will be the most amazing experience for students and staff.

Highcliffe highlights will include;

- staying in a really remote hotel on the side of an extinct volcano, miles from nowhere and on a vast volcanic lava field
- touching 1,000 year old ice at the foot of one of Iceland's largest glaciers the ice has a blue colour to it as the oxygen gets forced out with age
- visiting the most northerly capital on the planet, Reykjavik (Smokey Bay in Viking speak)
- outdoor swimming in sub-zero temperatures where the water is geothermally heated warm swimming with frozen hair as the wind chill can reach minus 15 deg. C
- the Secret Lagoon where Icelanders go in preference to the Blue Lagoon
