### ANTI-BULLYING AMBASSADORS NEEDED! (MYP)

Our school is looking to update our anti-bullying approach:

- How we can raise awareness of this very important issue
- Steps we can take to make sure everyone feels safe in school
- Knowing what to do and where to go if bullying is taking place

As part of this, we are looking to recruit a team of students to become **Anti-Bullying Ambassadors.** 

Collectively, our team of Ambassador's main aim will be to raise awareness and to prevent and tackle bullying here at Highcliffe School. The activities Ambassadors become involved in will include:

- Helping spread the message of anti-bullying across the school
- Identifying issues relating to bullying before they escalate
- Offering support and guidance to students who are being bullied
- 'Being there' for people who need them
- Providing a range of facilities and activities to help prevent bullying
- Keeping up to date with training opportunities
- Helping to run events in partnership with other organisations
- Meeting with the other ambassadors regularly to discuss progress and issues that have arisen
- Working with staff, as well as students, to prevent bullying

We would like Ambassadors to come from all year groups and will go through training to equip them with the fundamental skills and knowledge needed to deal with all types of bullying within a school environment.

To start with, we are looking for 12 students to attend training with over 100 students from local schools at the end of this term. We will then add to our number of ambassadors in September, at the part of the new school year.
