This week's "Word of the Week" is ...

ambivalent

What does "ambivalent" mean? Does is mean ...?

- 1/ To have mixed feelings towards something or someone.
- 2/ To be both left and right-handed.
- 3/ An atmosphere

Answer:

The answer is 1. It is an adjective. We can use this word if you have mixed and opposing feelings towards something, and you're not sure where you stand on something.

Examples:

Some people love Marmite; some people hate it. I'm ambivalent about it.

I have **ambivalent** feelings towards that character.

Critical Thinking:

What are you ambivalent about? Can you describe what it is that makes you feel ambivalent? Consider the following. Are you ambivalent about these topics?

- Taxing food with lots of sugar in
- The police having guns

Commendation Opportunities:

Do you use this word? That's your challenge.

Try and use the word "ambivalent" in class both in writing or in speech. You might get commended for an effective use of it!

Break-through commendation: If you use it incorrectly first time, but try again, you might receive a break-through commendation!
